

Andrea Burk

Born and raised in North Vancouver, BC, Andrea Burk's path to the international stage started as a young rugby player on the Capilano Rugby Football Club women's team and then at Carson Graham Secondary School playing high school rugby. Following university, Burk became a dominant player for the Capilano's women's team and the BC provincial team.

Burk earned her first international cap with Canada's Women's Rugby Team in 2009 against France, where she started the match on the wing. From there, Burk went on to earn a total of 38 caps throughout her international playing career, scoring 8 tries, 37 conversions, and 15 penalty kicks for a total of 159 points.

Burk represented Canada at the 2014 and 2017 Rugby World Cups, and was part of the Canadian side that earned a silver medal in 2014, facing England in the final after a historic semi-final win over France. Burk also named to Canada's Women's Sevens Team roster for Las Vegas in 2011 and Hong Kong in 2012.

Off the field and since retiring from rugby, Burk has continued to be a champion for the game, particularly for girls and women. She has been a regular on TSN and CBC rugby broadcasts as an analyst where her dynamic personality is displayed and continues to make her a leader amongst the Canadian rugby community.
