RUGBY CANADA

Rugby Canada is the national governing body of the sport of rugby union in Canada. It is responsible for providing support to all 10 provincial rugby unions in Canada through administrative oversight and the development and implementation of uniform policies national registration and insurance programs, professional development programs for coaches and officials, and national grassroots and community initiatives to promote the sport.

Rugby Canada is also responsible for Canada's men's and women's high performance rugby programs in both the 7s and the 15s formats. Its responsibilities include talent identification, player selection, training and management of Canada's national teams for international and Olympic competition, and the promotion and support of bids for international rugby competitions in Canada.

QUICK FACTS & RESULTS

- Historic Olympic Silver Medal At the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, Canada's Women's Rugby Sevens Team secured a historic silver medal, marking their best Olympic performance to date.
- **Historic Win Over New Zealand** In 2024, Canada's Women's Rugby Team secured a landmark victory over New Zealand, reinforcing their status as a global rugby powerhouse.
- **Men's Olympic Participation** Canada's Men's Rugby Sevens Team qualified for the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, finishing eighth overall in their inaugural Olympic appearance.
- Women's World Cup Success The Canadian Women's Rugby Team has participated in every Women's Rugby World Cup since 1991, finishing as runners-up in 2014 and consistently placing among the top teams. In 2025 they will again compete for World Cup Glory as the No.2 ranked Women's 15s Team in the World.
- Men's Sevens Bronze at Pan American Games At the 2023 Pan American Games, Canada's Men's Rugby Sevens Team secured a bronze medal, showcasing their competitive strength in the region.
- Women's Sevens Commonwealth Performance The Canadian Women's Rugby Sevens Team finished fourth at the 2022 Commonwealth Games, demonstrating their strong presence in international competition.
- **Consistent World Cup Appearances** The Canadian Men's Rugby Team has qualified for every Rugby World Cup from 1987 to 2019, showcasing their longstanding presence on the global stage.
- Community Engagement and Development Rugby Canada continues to invest in grassroots development, recognizing the importance of growing the sport at the community level across the country.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF RUGBY CANADA

The Role: Board Director

The Board of Directors of Rugby Canada serves as the governing body responsible for overseeing and guiding the organization's activities and affairs. The board's key responsibilities include:

- Strategic Planning & Budgeting identifying the strategic goals and priorities of Rugby Canada as well as the associated risks, and the strategy by which it proposes to achieve those goals and mitigate the risks.
- Self-Governance Upholding best practices in board operations and decision-making.
- Human Resources Providing oversight on leadership and staffing matters.
- **Performance Monitoring** Evaluating organizational effectiveness and success.
- Health & Safety Ensuring robust policies, procedures, and systems to protect all participants.
- Effective Communication Maintaining transparency and engagement with stakeholders.
- Legal & Compliance Upholding all regulatory and ethical standards.

Board Structure & Expectations

Directors are elected for a three-year term and may be re-elected for a second term. The board meets in person three to four times annually in various locations across Canada. Additionally, three to four virtual meetings are typically held each year as needed.

Board members are expected to act as ambassadors for Rugby Canada, engaging with their local communities, potential donors, and commercial sponsors. They are also encouraged to support the national teams by attending events and promoting their activities.

• Legal & Governance Expertise

Demonstrated understanding of board duties and responsibilities, with strong familiarity in governance principles and best practices. Skilled in contributing to board governance policies to establish and maintain effective governance frameworks. Experience in overseeing compliance, risk management, and fiduciary responsibilities to support organizational integrity and accountability. Legal expertise or advanced governance proficiency preferred.

• Marketing & Brand Strategy

Senior marketing professional with expertise in brand positioning, audience engagement, and strategic communications. Proven ability to develop and execute marketing strategies that enhance visibility, stakeholder engagement, and revenue growth. Experience in digital marketing, sponsorship development, and public relations to strengthen organizational impact. Strong understanding of market trends, data-driven decision-making, and community outreach to support mission-driven initiatives.

High-Performance Sport Leadership

Extensive experience in elite-level sport, preferably rugby, in a senior leadership role such as High-Performance Director, Coach, General Manager, senior executive, or owner of a national, international, or professional sports organization. Deep expertise in high-performance sport, with direct involvement in strategy development and execution. Strong understanding of athlete development, competition structures, and the operational requirements of high-performance programs.
